Minimum Qualifications*:

- \$110 non-refundable application fee
- U.S. citizenship or legally authorized to work in the United States
- High school diploma or equivalent (GED)
- Valid driver's license

***Note:** these are the minimum threshold requirements for the CO Firefighter Testing Consortium. Individual departments may hold more stringent requirements. In order to be considered for each agency you must comply with their minimum standards. For example, some agencies require EMT-B and HazMat certifications, however, the timing of the requirement may differ. Please see the department(s) job description for specific information on individual departments.

Testing Information:

Testing will be held on October 17th and October 20th in both the Denver, CO and Chicagoland areas. Registration for testing dates will occur after the application deadline. You will be notified of your eligibility for testing on October 1, 2018.

If you tested in the spring 2018 consortium, you do not need to reapply unless you would like to retest in attempt to improve your score. Testing scores are valid for a one-year period. If you would like to retain the score that you achieved in the spring 2018 process, no further action is required. Your score will automatically be combined with the fall 2018 testing cycle.
