NORTH METRO FIRE, BROOMFIELD POLICE TO HOLD 9/11 CEREMONY

Broomfield, CO—On Wednesday, September 11th, North Metro Fire Rescue District, the Broomfield Police Department and the City of Broomfield will hold their annual 9/11 Ceremony at the Broomfield Amphitheater in Community Park. The ceremony will take place at 8 a.m. and is free and open to the public.

“Each year we feel it’s important to remember the 3,023 lives lost on September 11. Of those, 380 were firefighters and police officers responding to the call for help,” said North Metro Fire Chief Joseph Bruce. “It’s our hope to come together as a community and honor those heroes, victims and their families and to never forget the sacrifices made on that tragic day.”

The ceremony will take approximately 20 minutes. It will include a joint honor guard service from the Broomfield Police Department and North Metro Fire Rescue as well as a bugler and bagpiper. The ceremony will begin at the Broomfield Amphitheater and will include a procession over to the 9/11 Memorial. Adjoining the memorial grounds on Lamar Street, two fire engines will raise their ladders together and display an American flag in remembrance.
