North Metro Fire hosts 9Health Fair on April 18 in Broomfield

Residents can access free or low-cost health screenings in one place regardless of insurance

Broomfield/Northglenn, CO — North Metro Fire Rescue District is partnering with area healthcare providers to bring 9Health Fair to the area on April 18. The health fair provides area residents free and low-cost health screenings all in one location for a day, whether the patient has insurance or not.

Residents have access to a number of services and specialists, including:

- Blood Draw (phlebotomy) and Screening
- Blood Pressure Screening
- Dental Screening
- Dermatology Screening
- Dietitian Assessment and Counseling
- Height, Weight, BMI Screening
- Mammography/Breast Screening
- Rheumatoid Arthritis Screening
- Spinal Screening
- Stress Management Screening and Counseling

- Broomfield Senior Services
- Colon Cancer Kits
- Connect for Health
- Hepatitis C
- Pancreatic Cancer

In years past, information from the screenings has actually helped some residents obtain an early diagnosis for a health condition that may have otherwise gone undetected for a longer period of time. The 9Health Fair is free to attend and provides a convenient way to get a number of checkups in one place on one day.

The health fair will be hosted from 7 a.m. until noon on April 18 at the Broomfield United Methodist Church located at 545 W. 10th Avenue.
