North Metro Fire Responds to Townhome Fire in Northglenn

Northglenn, CO—North Metro Fire Rescue District responded to a townhome fire at 11542 Community Center Drive shortly after midnight on Sept. 3.

A fire started on the back patio of a two-story townhome and spread up the exterior corner of the home before extending into the attic. Northglenn Police arrived shortly after the 911 call came in at 12:17 a.m. from a neighbor and began evacuating residents from the adjoining units. There were three residents living in the townhome that caught on fire who were able to safely evacuate, although one was transported for further evaluation.

North Metro Fire crews were on scene within minutes and stopped the fire from spreading through the attic to other townhome units. They also helped rescue two dogs residing in the affected home. The damage from the fire was contained to the exterior and attic of the townhome, but some water damage did occur within the unit as a result of the fire attack.

The cause of the fire is still under investigation, but no criminal activity is suspected.
