North Metro Fire Invites Community to Annual Flag Retirement Ceremony and Open House

Northglenn/Broomfield, CO—North Metro Fire Rescue District and the Broomfield Veterans Memorial Museum are joining together to host the 12th Annual Flag Retirement Ceremony on Saturday, June 11, in Broomfield. Following the ceremony, there will be an open house at the fire station and patriotic hot dog cookout.

The event will be held at North Metro Fire Station 61 at 1275 Midway Boulevard beginning at 11 a.m. A combined honor guard from North Metro Fire and Broomfield Police Department will be a part of the ceremony as well as North Metro Fire Chief David Ramos and representatives from the Broomfield Veterans Memorial Museum. A local bugler will also perform as part of the service.

“We’re looking forward to partnering with our local veterans to honor the American flag, a symbol of freedom that hundreds of thousands have fought to protect over the years,” said Ramos. “This event can be enjoyed by all generations and is especially great for teaching our youth the significance of the flag and how to properly retire it.”
