North Metro Fire Hosts Toy Drive for A Precious Child

Broomfield/Northglenn, CO — North Metro Fire Rescue District is partnering with A Precious Child to collect toys over the next three weeks to brighten the holidays for local children in need. The toy drive will begin Friday, Nov. 20, and run through Friday, Dec. 11. Residents are encouraged to donate new toys or gift cards in an effort to serve more than 7,000 children this year. Collection bins will be in place at four of the fire district's stations and its headquarters building.
